Chair Esther Terry called the meeting to order at 9:00 AM.

CITIZEN COMMENT: John Mooring greeted all present with Good morning. Democratic Party Chair Yarborough Williams provided comments regarding the new appointments.

Henry Durham made a motion to appoint James Roberts as Secretary for the Board of Elections. The motion was seconded by Steven Mullenix and passed 4-0.

ELECTION PROGRAMMING: During this period, we have completed media preparation and testing of all precincts for the March 3, 2020 Primary. The task took an entire week. Even with the assistance of a 5- member team from Print-elect in addition to BOE full time as well as part-time staff, we have tested all ballot styles (157), checked machines, prepared media for the SBOE Mock Election as well as secured the machines for election day.

We have ordered sufficient stock of ballot materials as well as printed ballots for Election Day. Having a sufficient supply of printed ballots is required by the SBOE in the event of power outages. Shipment of election day ballots is expected any day now.

We have all of the equipment in place with the exception of our new voting booths which are scheduled to arrive around the 24th of February. In the meantime, we have borrowed enough booths from Vance County to get through One stop early voting.

We have been working on the One stop space to make it more user friendly with our new voting systems. With the help of Warren County Buildings and Grounds staff we have made some changes to setup that we hope will ensure a better flow of traffic during the election and early voting.

Voter registration is up and we expect to see this continue throughout the early voting period.

Staff are processing and mailing voter cards daily.

Electronic Poll Books data has been updated with the vendor and their representative will be on site during poll worker training to train staff.

One-stop laptops have been prepared for early voting and ready. Note-the check-in system used during early voting is slightly different from the one used on election

day and is tied to our server. I am able to sit at my desk and view voter turnout as the data is uploaded to the server.

We have hired 12 temporary part-time staff for one stop operations. Training of staff will be held on Monday, February 10, 2020. Some have worked with our office previously, however, we will welcome several new persons to the one stop team. We are truly grateful for the assistance that Warren County Human Resources has provided in getting the new staff payroll information in place.

Chief Judge Manuals have been updated with new voting systems information in addition to easy steps for operation.

We completed the National Change of Address mailing which is generated by the US Postal Service and forwarded to the NC State Board of Elections. The mailing helps BOE's maintain up to date databases. When counties receive notice of someone having moved to the county, we forward a voter registration application to them so that they are able to register in our county. County boards are also able to transmit the data electronically to other counties.

Updated Multi-partisan packets have been prepared and forwarded to those persons serving on the team that visits nursing homes. The packets reflect changes in the law. The Warren BOE appointed team members in late d2019 for the Presidential Election Year.

Our staff has completed 2 updates pushed out by the SBOE on our systems during this period.
