Amendment #2 to the FY 2021 Warren County Budget Ordinance: 1) Increase Finance Dept budget by \$4,200 to re-budget funds supporting services with Tyler Technologies assist implementation of leave accruals into the financial software system. 2) Decreases Contingency Funds in Buildings & Grounds budget by \$9,850; increase maintenance budget in Board of Elections, funds used to replace old sidewalk/handicap ramp at main entrance. 3) Increase Animal Control budget by \$2,500 for grant funds received from the N.C. Veterinary Medical Association, purchase cat cages. 4) Increase EDC budget by \$7,000 cover cost of a Consultant to assist with the submission of Economic Adjustment Assistance (EDA) CARES Act Grant, leading to a marketing plan for redevelopment of Soul City and Resiliency Plan for Warren County. 5) Increases Health Dept budget by \$180,489 for COVID-19 Grant. Part represents a carryforward of unspent grant funds from FY 2020 (\$28,796 – COVID 619 Grant) and the remaining amount represents three additional Grants received/awarded in FY 2021 (\$20,000 – NCCU Grant); (\$20,447 – COVID 539 Grant); and (\$111,246 – COVID 543 Grant). 6) Increase DSS – Administration budget by \$1,283.62 as a result of increased funding for the Duke Energy Progress – Energy Neighbor Fund.



Background

The County has received a proposal from Professor Jeanne Milliken Bonds, Professor of the Practice, Impact Investment and Sustainable Finance, Kenan-Flagler Business School, University of North Carolina. Ms. Bonds has experience with the Federal Reserve and she works with Federal Legislators on national finance policies and legislation.

Because of her knowledge of Warren County and the County's history and economic prospects, she has proposed to 1) prepare an Economic Adjustment Assistance (EDA) grant proposal, aligned with regional Comprehensive Economic Development Strategy (CEDS) goals, to design and implement specific strategies to bring about economic change in response to continuous long-term structural economic challenges worsened by the COVID-19 pandemic; and, 2) Research and prepare proposals for additional opportunities from private philanthropic, corporate, government or a combination sources to support the development of a strategic marketing plan for Soul City.

Under the CARES ACT, we do not have to meet any matching requirements like a regular EDA proposal. It is hoped that the proposals will lead to a marketing plan for the redevelopment of Soul City and a Resiliency Plan for Warren County. Professor Bonds will attend your August Work Session to discuss this process in detail.

Recommendation

I recommend authorizing the County Manager to apply for the grant funds from the EDA and to use FY 21 Contingency Funds to fund the proposal of submission.

Background

Budget Amendment #2 to the FY 2021 Budget Ordinance is being presented for approval. This amendment does the follow:

- 1) Increases appropriations in the Finance Dept budget by \$4,200 – to re-budget funds that were approved in March 2020 – but never spent. These funds are for support services with Tyler Technologies – to assist department staff with implementation of leave accruals into the financial software system.
- 2) Decreases appropriation of Contingency Funds in the Buildings & Grounds budget by \$9,850 and increases the maintenance line item budget in the Board of Elections by this same amount. These funds will be used to cover the cost of replacing the old sidewalk and handicap ramp at the main entrance to the building which houses the Board of Elections.
- 3) Increases appropriations in the Animal Control budget by \$2,500 to budget grant funds received from the N.C. Veterinary Medical Association. These funds will be used to purchase a set of cat cages.
- 4) Increases appropriations in the EDC budget by \$7,000 to cover the cost of a Consultant to assist with the submission of an Economic Adjustment Assistance (EDA) CARES Act Grant – which hopefully lead to a marketing plan for the redevelopment of Soul City and a Resiliency Plan for Warren County. At its regular meeting on 8/3/2020, the Board of County Commissioners approved a consultant fee in an amount between \$5,000 and a not to exceed amount of \$7,000 for this purpose.
- 5) Increases appropriations in the Health Dept budget by \$180,489 for grants related to COVID-19. Part of this represents a carryforward of unspent grant funds from FY 2020 (\$28,796 – Covid 619 Grant) and the remaining amount represents three additional Grants received/awarded in FY 2021 (\$20,000 – NCCU Grant); (\$20,447 – Covid 539 Grant); and (\$111,246 – Covid 543 Grant).
- 6) Increases appropriations in the DSS – Administration budget by \$1,283.62 as a result of increased funding for the Duke Energy Progress – Energy Neighbor Fund.

This amendment:

- Increases appropriations in the Finance Dept budget by \$4,200 - to rebudget funds that were approved in March 2020 - but never spent. These funds are for support services with Tyler Technologies - to assist department staff with implementation of leave accruals into the financial software system.

- Decreases appropriation of Contingency Funds in the Buildings & Grounds budget by \$9,850 and increases the maintenance line item budget in the Board of Elections by this same amount. These funds will be used to cover the cost of replacing the old sidewalk and handicap ramp at the main entrance to the building which houses the Board of Elections.

- Increases appropriations in the EDC budget by \$7,000 to cover the cost of a Consultant to assist with the submission of an Economic Adjustment Assistance (EDA) CARES Act Grant which would assist with a marketing plan for the redevelopment of Soul City and a Resiliency Plan for Warren County. At its regular meeting on 8/3/2020, the Board of County Commissioners approved a consultant fee in an amount between \$5,000 and a not to exceed amount of \$7,000 for this purpose.

Background

The EPA Brownfields Assessment Grant provides funding for a grant recipient to inventory, characterize, assess, conduct a range of planning activities, develop site-specific cleanup plans, and conduct community involvement related to brownfield sites. The performance period for these grants is three years. The assessment grant is not the same as the EPA Brownfields Cleanup Grant. The U.S. Environmental Protection Agency's (EPA) Brownfields Program provides funds to empower states, communities, and other stakeholders to work together to prevent, assess, safely clean up, and sustainably reuse brownfields.

In FY 20, Warren County submitted an application to the EPA for the Brownfields Assessment Grant in the amount of \$300,000 (no county match required). This grant application was done in partnership with Terracon Consultants, Inc. at no cost to the county. Warren County did not receive the grant, but did score well.

Warren County Economic Development and the County Manager's Office would like to resubmit an application with improvements for a \$300,000 Brownfields Assessment Grant for the EPA's FY 21 cycle. In accordance with the Warren County Grant Policy, an application of this amount requires approval by the Warren County Board of Commissioners.

Terracon is providing their services free of fees, which would typically range from \$12,000-\$15,000 for grant writing services from their firm. This opportunity was offered in FY 20 and included a re-write in FY 21 if a grant was not secured in the first round.

Recommendation

Approval of Warren County's FY 21 EPA Brownfields Assessment Grant application in the amount of \$300,000.

The Surplus Property Process:

1. Once the property taxes on a particular property have been determined to be non-collectable, the property information is sent to the County's foreclosure attorney.
2. The attorney does the necessary title work and goes through the process of contacting the owners.
3. During notification through the certified mail process the owners are given the opportunity to pay the delinquent taxes and retain ownership.
4. If the owners do not pay the delinquent taxes the attorney goes before the court to get permission to sale the property.
5. After a judge approves the sale, it is auctioned on the courthouse steps to the highest bidder.
6. If there are no bidders the County becomes the owner by having a lien against the property.
7. The property can then be declared surplus by the Commissioners and authorized to be sold.

Warren County Parks and Recreation advertised an invitation for bids (IFB) using funds from the PARTF grant for the Magnolia Ernest Recreation Park. The bids were advertised in our local newspaper and the State’s electronic bidding system. The bids (IFB) were due on August 10th and opened on Wednesday, August 12th. Contractors were eligible to bid the whole project or individual project elements. The scope of services was for six different elements of the project. We received at least two bids for each element except for the bath house renovations. The bath house renovation came in way over budget and the bid for that project will be rejected

I am recommending that the following bidders be selected for the project at the Magnolia Ernest Recreation Park:

The total cost of the PARTF grant was for \$297,540.00.
