**RESOLUTION TO ADOPT
THE WARREN COUNTY WASTEWATER TREATMENT PLANT
ADDITIONAL LOAN FOR PHASE 2 REHABILITATION**

WHEREAS, maintenance improvements to the wastewater treatment plant will help protect public health and the environment, provide for stewardship of existing capital equipment, and control the cost of wastewater treatment; and

WHEREAS, the goals and plans set forth in the Warren County Wastewater Treatment Plan Asset Management Plan for Fiscal Years 2011-2012 through 2020-2021 are consistent with this grant-funded rehabilitation project and provide an opportunity for continuing to improve our cooperative efforts to meet wastewater management needs of our citizens; and

WHEREAS, a reduced overall construction estimate of approximately \$1,673,792 leaves a balance of \$472,132 not covered by the NC DEQ grant, but which can be financed through NC DEQ at zero percent interest for twenty years; and

WHEREAS, both grant and loan portions are to be shared on a percentage basis by Warrenton, Norlina and Warren County, with the estimated cost to the Town of Warrenton of \$931.30 per month, the estimated cost to Norlina of \$520.60 per month, the cost to Warren County of \$657.50 per month for a total of 240 months or 20 years; NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE WARREN COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS:

THAT the above loan amount of \$472,132 and terms offered by NC DEQ be authorized; THAT user fees associated with sewer service will be reviewed annually and modified as necessary.

RE: **NCDOT Bridge #44 and #77 Relocation project in
Warren County**

The North Carolina Department of Transportation recently scheduled (2) two bridges in Warren County to be replaced. Those bridges were identified by NCDOT as Bridge #44 on Baltimore Road and Bridge #77 on Bethlehem Road. Both Bridges projects were impacted by existing water lines owned and operated by Warren County and were in need of relocation to insure continued customer service as well as the structural integrity of the water lines.

Warren County and NCDOT entered into a previously approved contract that allowed Warren County to design and construct both relocated water lines at the expense of NCDOT.

Both Projects are now complete and in need of close out so Warren County can pay the contractor (Herring & Rivenbark) for the water line relocation. Close out of these projects will then allow Warren County to receive their reimbursement of the project cost from NCDOT. A Warren County Public Utilities Representative will be available for questions if needed.

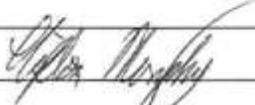

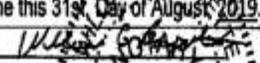

THIS AGREEMENT is made and entered into on the last date executed below, by and between the North Carolina Department of Transportation, an agency of the State of North Carolina, hereinafter referred to as the "Department" and Warren County, hereinafter referred to as the "County".

WITNESSED

WHEREAS, the Department will reimburse Warren County for utility and maintenance of facilities at the I-85 southbound lane NC Rest Area/Welcome Center at the NC/VA state line; and,

WHEREAS, this Agreement is made under the authority granted to the Department by the North Carolina General Assembly, including but not limited to, the following applicable legislation: General Statutes of North Carolina, Section 136-66.1, Section 160A-296 and 297, Section 136-18, and Section 20-169;

NOW, THEREFORE, the parties hereto, each in consideration of the promises and undertakings of the other as herein provided, do hereby covenant and agree, each with the other, as follows:

1. This Agreement is to reimburse Warren County for utility and maintenance bills for the pump station facilities at the I-85 southbound lane NC Welcome Center at the NC/VA state line.
2. It is estimated that the annual maintenance costs will not exceed \$20,000. However, the County will notify the Department, in advance, if annual repair costs are anticipated to exceed this amount. The County shall obtain prior approval from the Department before expending funds greater than \$5,000 for any one quarter.

3. The Department will not be responsible for any maintenance and/or repair costs to the generator, nor will the Department be responsible for any costs of maintenance and/or repairs to the pump station that are caused by the generator.
4. The County agrees to accept from the Rest Area/Welcome Center 15,000 gallons of sewage per day with peak days of 20,000 gallons of sewage per day. The County further agrees to accept increased future sewage flow attributed to normal traffic increases.
5. The Department shall reimburse the County actual cost for the maintenance and/or repair of the pump stations. The Department shall be billed up to \$5,000 quarterly by the County at the Division Office for the maintenance and/or repair of the pump stations. All final bills must be submitted within one (1) year of said usage.

ANNUAL RENEWALS

6. This Agreement shall be in full force and effect on the first day of the month following the date that this Agreement is fully executed by the Department and the County. If needed, the Agreement may be modified by mutual agreement of the parties. The Agreement may be renewed annually for a total of 5 years from the date of full execution, incorporating any mutually agreed-upon adjustments or revisions if needed. Either party may terminate the said agreement upon 60 days written notice.

.ADDITIONAL PROVISIONS

7. It is the policy of the Department not to enter into any agreement with another party that has been debarred by any government agency (Federal or State). The County certifies, by signature of this agreement, that neither it nor its agents or contractors are presently debarred, suspended, proposed for debarment, declared ineligible or voluntarily excluded from participation in this transaction by a Federal or State Department or Agency.
8. The other party to this Agreement shall comply with Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 (Title 49 CFR, Subtitle A, Part 21) and related nondiscrimination authorities. Title VI and related authorities prohibit discrimination on the basis of race, color, national origin, disability, gender, and age in all programs or activities of any recipient of Federal assistance.
9. A copy or facsimile copy of the signature of any party shall be deemed an original with each fully executed copy of the Agreement as binding as an original, and the parties agree that this Agreement can be executed in counterparts, as duplicate originals, with facsimile signatures sufficient to evidence an agreement to be bound by the terms of the Agreement.

Approval of Recreation Fees

The Parks and Recreation Commission appointed a committee to discuss the recreation fees that are charged to use the Parks and Recreation facilities. This committee met on August 13th and presented their findings to the Parks and Recreation Commission at their September 12th meeting. Additional information on the recreation fee was discussed and another meeting for the committee was scheduled on October 24th. The recommendation from the committee was presented to the Parks and Recreation Commission at their November 14th meeting. Further clarification was needed on some items and so the Parks and Recreation Commission had a called meeting on Tuesday, December 3rd to discuss the recreation fees. The Parks and Recreation Commission approved the new proposed rates at this meeting. One of the main changes was going from \$75/hour to \$45/hour for general public (admission charged). The reason for this change was based on community feedback that this rate was too high and checking with surrounding counties and setting the rate more consistent with the other counties. The other main change was the hourly rate charged for use of the gym. A daily rate was also added to this usage. There also some clarification to ball field usage rates.

I recommend that we approve the proposed recreation fees which the Parks and Recreation Commission approved at the December 3rd called meeting.
