The Juvenile Crime Prevention Council (JCPC) has studied the risk factors and needs of Juvenile Court involved youth in this county and hereby publishes this Request for Proposals. The JCPC anticipates funds from the Department of Juvenile Justice and Delinquency Prevention (DJJDP) in the amount stated above to fund the program types specified below. Such programs will serve delinquent and at-risk youth for the state fiscal year 2010 - 2011 beginning on or after July 1, 2010. The use of the DJJDP funds in this county requires match in the amount specified above.

The JCPC will consider proposals for the following needed Programs

Proposed Program Services should target the following Risk factors for Delinquency or Repeated Delinquency:

Youth coming to the attention of Warren County Juvenile Services are generally at low risk for re-offending. Five percent (5%) of the population, however, have a greater chance of re-offending based on the risk and needs assessment instrumented that is utilized as an indicator. Youth are committing offenses at a younger age (under 12) and thirty-nine percent (39%) of the youth have had previous contact with Warren County Juvenile Services. Youth are exhibiting associative behaviors are in need of developing pro-social peer relationships and are in need of additional mental health and substance abuse services. Parents report that they are experiencing difficulties supervising their youth.

Programs should address the following concerns as reported in the Needs Assessments for Adjudicated Youth:

Peer Domain: Indicators suggest that youth are in need of pro-social peer relationships. Indicators also suggest that youth are associating with other delinquent peers.
Individual Domain: Indicators suggest that youth are committing status offenses, runaway behaviors and are in need of further assessment of substance use.
Family Domain: Indicators suggest that there is domestic discord and some alcohol or drug abuse present in the home environment. Parents possess marginal skill levels. Fifteen percent (15%) of the youth have family members with criminal histories, gang involvement, or family members who are actively under a court's supervision.
School Domain: Youth are in need of developing positive interpersonal skills. Indicators suggest that youth are exhibiting behaviors in the school setting that result in frequent suspensions from the school setting. Youth also are functioning below grade level and are in need of academic enrichment services.

Applicants are being sought that are able to address the legislatively mandated items below:

1. Program services compatible with research that is shown to be effective with juvenile offenders.
2. Program services are outcome-based
3. The program has an evaluation component.
4. Program services detect gang participation and divert individuals from gang participation
5. Programs that can have a demonstrable impact on the following success factors: a. reduce the use of alcohol or controlled substances; b. reduce subsequent complaints; c. reduce violation of terms of community supervision; d. reduce convictions for subsequent offenses; e. fulfill restitution to victims; and f. increase parental accountability.
