The Juvenile Crime Prevention Council (JCPC) has studied the risk factors and needs of Juvenile Court involved youth in this county and hereby publishes this Request for Proposals. The JCPC anticipates funds from the NC Dept. of Public Safety, Division of Juvenile Justice in the amount stated above to fund the program types specified below. Such programs will serve delinquent and at-risk youth for the state fiscal year 2016-2017 beginning on, or after, July 1, 2016. The use of these funds in this county requires a local match in the amount specified above.

The JCPC will consider proposals for the following needed programs:

Proposed program services should target the following risk factors for delinquency or repeat delinquency:

The 36 youth coming to the attention of Warren County Juvenile Services are generally at low risk for re-offending. Nineteen percent (19%) of the population, however, are at medium to high risk of re-offending based on the risk and needs assessment instrument that is utilized as an indicator. Significant findings from the risk data include 23% or 8 youth were under the age of 12 when first delinquent offense was alleged. Thirty-five percent (35%) of the youth have had previous contact with Warren County Juvenile Services. Youth are exhibiting behaviors and are in need of developing pro-social peer relationships and are in need of additional mental health and substance abuse services. Parents report that they are experiencing difficulties supervising their youth.

Programs should address the following concerns as reported in the Needs Assessments for adjudicated youth in FY 2014-2015. Please be advised that there were Needs Assessments performed on 35 youth in FY 2014-2015. The numbers provided below represent the "percentage" of that group of 35 youth.

Peer Domain:	For youth assessed in FY 14-15, indicators suggest that 20% of youth have some association with delinquent peers, 6% have regular association with delinquent peers, and 6% have gang associations.
Individual Domain:	For youth assessed in FY 14-15, indicators suggest that 20% of youth are in need of further assessment or treatment of substance abuse and 11% are in need of more mental health assessment.
Family Domain:	For youth assessed in FY 14-15, 17% of the youth assessed had parents with marginal or inadequate parenting skills. Forty percent (40%) of the youth have family members with criminal histories, gang involvement, or family members who are actively under a court's supervision.
School Domain:	For youth assessed in FY 14-15, indicators suggest that 68% (24 youth) are having moderate to serious behavioral problems in school that result in frequent suspensions from school. Twenty-six (26%) percent are functioning below grade level.

Applicants are being sought that are able to address items below:

1. Program services compatible with research that are shown to be effective with juvenile offenders.
2. Program services are outcome-based.
3. The program has an evaluation component.
4. Program services detect gang participation and divert individuals from gang participation.
5. Programs that can have a demonstrated impact on the following success factors: (a) reduce the use of alcohol or controlled substances; (b) reduce subsequent complaints; (c) reduce violation of terms of community supervision; (d) reduce convictions for subsequent offenses; (e) fulfill restitution to victims and (f) increase parental accountability.

Local public agencies, 501(c)(3) non-profit corporations and local housing authorities are invited to submit applications to provide services addressing the above elements.
