A moment of silence was followed by Rules for Citizen Comments read by Angelena Kearney-Dunlap, Clerk to the Board.

Citizen Comments:

Raymond Adcock - Native of County, taxpayer, voter, strong supporter of constitution. Ann Brown - Lake Gaston area, is there an ordinance on the books regarding deserted automobiles?

Linda Calisto - Lake Gaston area - are people allowed to burn old trailers near the lake?

Ruth Jones - spoke in favor of Loaves & Fishes Ministries - don't make them give up the building

Ava King - spoke in favor of Loaves & Fishes Ministries - best thing for county, it may be used or abused but it is good.

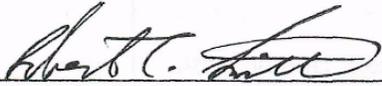

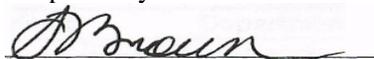

After holding a required public hearing on Monday - March 14, 2005 at 6:45 pm to hear citizen comments regarding a request to "Rezone 16 +/- acres on SR 1362 and NC Highway 903, situated in Roanoke Township from Residential to Neighborhood Business," the following action was taken.

On motion of Commissioner Richardson, which was seconded by Commissioner Humphries and duly carried by unanimous vote, it was ordered to approve request from David Williams to "Rezone 16 +/- acres on SR 1362 and NC Highway 903, situated in Roanoke Township from Residential to Neighborhood Business."

Motion was made by Commissioner Richardson, which was seconded by Commissioner Alston to pay invoice from Ringley Classic Plumbing, Inc. for emergency repairs performed in December 2004 at the Detention Center.

Commissioner Richardson withdrew his motion.

County Attorney Charles Johnson advised the Board of Commissioners that a policy needs to be developed regarding purchase requisitions and payment of emergency repairs.

Having considered a request from Alvis Fleming, area Dairy Farmer, on December 2004 and February 2005 to amend the County's "Ordinance to Require Connection to County Operated Water Distribution" to allow exemption of certain classes of livestock farmers, the following action was taken.

On motion of Commissioner Humphries, which was seconded by Commissioner Lucas it was ordered to approve a recommended amendment as submitted by County Attorney Johnson to add Classification of Users Exempt from "Ordinance Requiring Hook-up to Warren County's Water Distribution System."

After holding a first (1st) reading on Monday, February 7, 2005, a request to amend Allcare Ambulance Service Franchise Ordinance was presented for a second (2nd) reading.

On motion of Commissioner Lucas, which was seconded by Commissioner Humphries and duly carried by unanimous vote in accordance with NCGS 153A-250 and Warren County's Ambulance Franchise Ordinance, Allcare Ambulance Service Franchise Ordinance was amended as follows to allow Advanced Life Support (ALS):

2. Performance requirements:

A. Coverage requirements:

- * Nonemergency ambulance service included 24-hour Advanced Life Support EMT-Intermediate level as defined minimum E.M.T. - Intermediate Staffed Ambulance.

On motion of Commissioner Richardson, which was seconded by Commissioner Alston and duly carried by unanimous vote, it was approved to enter into a nine (9) year, eleven (11) month lease agreement with Loaves & Fishes Ministries, Inc. for the use of the old Department of Social Services building at 548 West Ridgeway Street. Loaves & Fishes Ministry, Inc is required to maintain sufficient liability insurance for the duration of the lease. County Attorney Johnson was ordered to draw up the appropriate lease agreement.

David Askew, Fire Marshal and Emergency Management Director, updated the Board on emergency responder communication capabilities:

- "1. It has come to the attention of the Warren County Fire Commission that the County wireless Internet system located at the Warrant on fair grounds water tower is interfering with the County fire repeater and frequency. This radio interference has an affect on (9) Volunteer Fire Departments and over 200 firefighters who depend on this radio repeater for paging and communications in support of emergency operations.

2. Efforts by the County to eliminate the interference have been made known as well as a reduction in the interference however, the interference still remains.
3. The radio interference has been so annoying to the 911 Telecommunicators that they have on occasions reduced the volume of the fire repeater frequency in the 911 Center which reduces their monitoring efforts.
4. At the latest Fire Commission meeting held on January 26, 2005 it was the unanimous consensus of the Warren County Fire Commission to write this letter and highly recommend to the Warren County manager in the interest of public safety that this County wireless internet system be removed completely and immediately from the Warrenton fair grounds water tower!"

David Askew, Fire Marshal and Emergency Management Director, presented radio study proposals for countywide assessment from the following vendors:

\$8,150 - Ira Wiesenfeld & Associates, Dallas, Texas

\$23,623 - SSI Services, Harrisburg, PA

Did not respond - Wireless Communication, Greensboro, NC

Funding source: Sheriff's budget (or general fund if funds are not available from Sheriff's budget)

On motion of Commissioner Lucas, which was seconded by Commissioner Richardson and duly carried by unanimous vote, Parks & Recreation Director Richard "Dickie" Williams was authorized to apply for NC 2005 Recreational Trails Program funds to construct a "Warren County Walking Trail". Total Project Cost of \$51,781. It is understood that the 20% required County Match (\$10,357) will be fulfilled by the value of the property.

On motion of Commissioner Lucas, which was seconded by Commissioner Alston and duly carried by unanimous vote, a non-binding, Letter of Intent concerning the structure of a planned multi-jurisdictional (Franklin, Granville, Vance & Warren Counties) industrial park development effort was approved as presented by Kerr-Tar Regional Council of Governments in conjunction with Warren County Economic Development Commission.

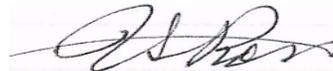
**WARREN COUNTY PUBLIC WORKS
ORDINANCE FOR DELETION OF WATER MAINS DURING
CONSTRUCTION**

The following Warren County Public Works Ordinance sets a County-Wide standard for the deletion of water mains from a construction contract. Warren County Public Works shall retain the right to execute this Ordinance at its discretion should the following requirements be met:

- The water main(s) in question has zero (0) user sign ups at the time the County awarded the construction contract, thus making construction of the water main economically unfeasible and/or
- The number of user signups at the time the County awarded the construction contract is not sufficient to make construction of the water main(s) economically feasible and/or
- By construction of the water main(s) in question, significant water quality issues may occur due to lack of user sign-up at the time the County awarded the construction contract.

If the above requirements are met Warren County Public Works may delete the water main(s) in question from an Executed Construction Contract via Contract Change Order or approved Work Change Directive.

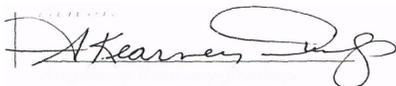

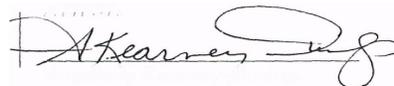
