

MINUTES FROM A PUBLIC HEARING TO HEAR CITIZEN COMMENTS REGARDING 2005-06 RURAL OPERATING ASSISTANCE PROGRAM (ROAP) APPLICATION HELD BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS FOR THE COUNTY OF WARREN IN THE LITTLETON CIVIC CENTER, LITTLETON, NC ON APRIL 20, 2005 AT 2:00 PM.

The public hearing was called to order by Chairman Ulysses S. Ross. Other commissioners present: Janet Humphries and Barry Richardson. Commissioners absent: Clinton G. Alston and H.E. Luke Lucas. Others in attendance - County Manager Loria D. Williams.

Clerk to the Board Angelena Kearney-Dunlap read aloud the notice of public hearing.

Citizen comments were as follows:

Vanetta Grant, Warren County Citizen inquired how much ROAP funds were available and what was its' use.

County Manager Williams explained the application process and formula used to disburse ROAP funds

Patricia Carter-Gray, Baltimore Maryland who has a brother that attends adult day care outside of Warren County wanted to know if he could benefit from ROAP funds.

County Manager Williams directed Ms. Carter-Gray and others that shared the same question to contact the agencies directly that utilized ROAP funds (i.e. DSS and Coordinating Council for Senior Citizens).

Roger Edwards, Adult Daycare Provider in Weldon, NC questioned if ROAP funds were available to transport Warren County residents to his facility?

With no further discussion and on motion of Commissioner Richardson which was seconded by Commissioner Humphries, the public hearing was adjourned at 2:30 pm.
