WARREN COUNTY SOLID WASTE ORDINANCE  
EXCERPTS FROM ORDINANCE

SECTION III STORAGE AND DISPOSAL

- A. No owner, occupant, tenant, or lessee of any property may deposit, store or permit to accumulate any solid waste on his property that is not stored or disposed of in a manner prescribed by this ordinance.
- B. The owner, occupant, tenant or lessee of any property shall remove or cause to be removed all solid waste from his property at least once each week (7-day period).
- C. Garbage shall be stored only in a container that is durable, rust-resistant, non-absorbent, watertight, and easily cleaned, with a close-fitting, fly-tight cover in place, with adequate handles or bails to facilitate handling. The capacity of the container may not exceed 32 gallons. Solid waste receptacles, as defined by this ordinance, may also be used for storage provided the requirements of this subsection are met. The number of containers shall be adequate to store one week's accumulation of garbage. Each container shall be kept clean to ensure that no odor or other nuisance condition exists.
- D. Refuse shall be stored in a manner that will resist harborage to rodents and vermin and will not create a fire hazard. Regulated refuse under this subsection includes, but is not limited to, lumber, boxes, barrels, bottles, cans, tires, paper, cardboard, rags, old furniture and other bulky waste, and white goods. Useful materials, such as firewood and building materials, may be stored on the premises, provided they are stored in a safe manner at a reasonable height above ground.
- E. No owner, occupant, tenant or lessee of a building or dwelling, other than a licensed junk dealer, may place or leave, or cause to be placed or left, outside the building or dwelling any bulky waste for longer than 72 hours.
- F. No owner, occupant, tenant or lessee of any building or dwelling may leave outside the building or dwelling, in a place accessible to

children, any abandoned or unattended icebox, refrigerator, or other receptacle that has an airtight door without first removing the door.

- G. Solid waste shall be disposed of only in one of the following ways: (1) in a landfill approved by the Department; (2) in an incinerator that has all required local, state and federal control permits; or (3) by any other method, including recycling and resource recovery that has been approved by the department.
- H. In addition to the methods listed in subsection G., above, refuse may be disposed of in solid waste receptacles provided by the County.
- I. No person may discard, dispose, leave, or dump any solid waste on or along any street or highway or public or private property unless such solid waste is placed in a receptacle or at a location designated for the deposit of solid waste.
- J. Construction wastes must be disposed of at disposal sites approved and permitted by the department.
- K. Regulated medical, hazardous and radioactive waste must be disposed of according to written procedures approved by the department.
- L. Any person collecting and transporting solid waste generated on such person's property for disposal at an approved disposal site shall comply with section VII.F.1 and 2 of this ordinance concerning vehicles and containers.
- M. All sharp objects shall be placed in a sealed, puncture-proof container prior to disposal.
- N. Open burning of solid waste is prohibited.

There will be a tipping fee for non-household items taken to the Transfer Station:

◆ An **Annual Household User Fee** of \$115 per household or business not subject to municipal taxation.

◆ A **Transfer Station Tipping Fee** of \$65 per ton shall be assessed for all waste brought to the County's Transfer Station.

◆ An **Inert Debris Tipping Fee** of \$18 per ton shall be assessed on all inert debris, yard waste and land-clearing debris, which is brought to the Landfill.

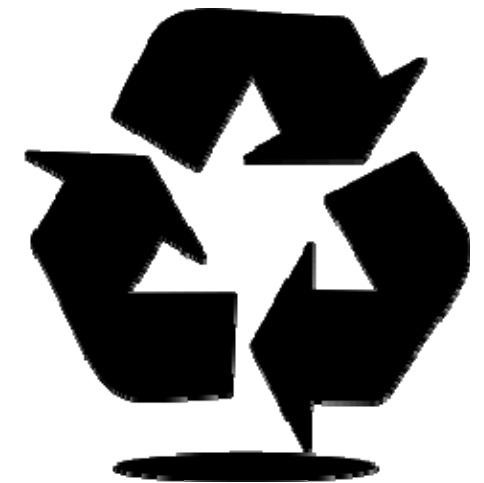

COMMINGLED RECYCLING!

Commingled (mixed) Recycling is easy and accepts a wide range of materials, which reduces the amount of disposal garbage and does not require sorting. Paper, metals and plastic bottles can be disposed of in one container. Please remove all food residues, and place only clean recyclables in the Commingled Container.

RECYCLABLE ITEMS ACCEPTED  
AT THE CONVENIENCE CENTERS

- ◆ Aluminum and Metal Food Cans
- ◆ Newspaper/Magazines/Advertising
- ◆ Paperboard (*cereal and shoe boxes*)
- ◆ Aseptic Juice Boxes
- ◆ Clean White Paper
- ◆ Junk Mail and Catalogs
- ◆ Gable-top Paper Cartons (*milk cartons*)
- ◆ Six Pack Rings
- ◆ Aluminum Foil
- ◆ Glass Bottles (*green, brown, & clear*)
- ◆ ABC Plastic Beverage Containers
- ◆ Tin and Steel Cans
- ◆ Plastic Bottles and Jugs (no lids/caps)
- ◆ Corrugated Cardboard (*separate container*). Please flatten large boxes.
- ◆ Used Batteries
- ◆ Used Motor Oil
- ◆ Used Antifreeze

WHAT SHOULD STAY OUT OF THE  
RECYCLING CONTAINERS?

- ◆ Yogurt Cups/Margarine Containers
- ◆ Frozen Food Trays/Plastic Wrap
- ◆ Stamps and Stickers in Junk Mail
- ◆ No Food or Soiled Paper
- ◆ No Car Parts or Light Bulbs

- ◆ No Lids, Caps or Plastic Bags
- ◆ No Plastic Cups, Plates or Utensils
- ◆ No Scrap Aluminum or Non-ferrous Metal
- ◆ No Garbage, Syringes or Glassware
- ◆ No Styrofoam Containers or Pellets
- ◆ No Disposable Diapers or Dish Rags
- ◆ No Plastic Take-out Food Containers
- ◆ No Paper Towels, Plates or Napkins
- ◆ No Ceramics and Dishes

When in doubt, throw it out!

THE FOLLOWING ITEMS ARE  
ACCEPTED AT EACH OF THE  
CONVENIENCE CENTERS:

- ◆ Household Trash
- ◆ White Goods (*washers, dryers, stoves, refrigerators, hot water heaters, air conditioners, etc.*). White Goods are not received at 725 US Highway 158 Business West - Site 2.
- ◆ Bulky Items (*mattresses, bed frames, couches, chairs, other furniture, etc.*) ***This waste is placed into the open top unit.***
- ◆ Commingled Recycling

THE FOLLOWING ITEMS ARE NOT  
ACCEPTED AT THE  
CONVENIENCE CENTERS:

- ◆ Commercial, Industrial or Contractor Waste
- ◆ Waste from Residents Outside of Warren County
- ◆ Burning or Smoldering Waste
- ◆ Yard Waste
- ◆ Waste that is Radioactive, Untreated, Regulated, Infectious, Hazardous or Liquid
- ◆ Poisons, Chemicals, Pesticides, Herbicides or Drums/Tanks
- ◆ Dead Animals

THE FOLLOWING ITEMS ARE  
ACCEPTED AT THE  
TRANSFER STATION:

- ◆ Inert Debris (*brick, block, asphalt, concrete, etc.*)
- ◆ White Goods (*washers, dryers, stoves, refrigerators, hot water heaters, air conditioners, etc.*) at no charge
- ◆ Yard Waste and Land-Clearing Debris (*limbs, leaves, brush, small trees, stumps, logs, etc.*)

THE FOLLOWING ITEMS ARE  
RECYCLED AT THE  
TRANSFER STATION:

- ◆ Fluorescent lights and mercury thermostats
- ◆ Electronics - *Personal Computers, Monitors, LCD Screen/Flat Screen Monitors, VCRs, Radios, Stereos, DVD Players, Microwaves, Power Supplies, Rechargeable Batteries, Vacuums, Banking Equipment, Telephones, Pagers, Networking Equipment, Laptops, Keyboards, Mice, Power Cables, Medical Equipment (Non-Hazardous), Printers, Copy Machines, Fax Machines, Cell Phones, Transformers, Scanners, Portable Electronic Devices, Servers, HUBS, Ink Cartridges, Toner Cartridges, Remote Modems, Projectors, Cameras, and Televisions*
- ◆ Tires and tubes at no charge for tire dealers. Only scrap tires that are generated in the normal course of business in North Carolina are eligible for free disposal at the county's tire collection site. A citizen (who is not a tire hauler, tire collector, or tire processor) can bring five (5) or less tires to the county's tire collection site at no cost, according to state statute. Therefore, a citizen who brings in six

(6) or more tires can be charged the disposal fee for those tires, as this constitutes a cleanup situation. Since the tires are coming from personal/private property and not from a business that generates scrap tires in the normal course of business, they are not eligible for free disposal.

THE FOLLOWING ITEMS ARE  
BANNED FROM THE LANDFILL:

- ◆ Oil Filters and Motor Oil
- ◆ Wooden Pallets
- ◆ Plastic Bottles
- ◆ Aluminum Cans
- ◆ Appliances
- ◆ ABC Beverage Containers
- ◆ Antifreeze and Lead-Acid Batteries
- ◆ Yard Waste and Whole Scrap Tires
- ◆ Discarded Computer Equipment
