

4-H W.A.Y. Program Report: March 2023

In March, we received 11 referrals to 4-H W.A.Y.

7 referrals from Warren County Middle School and 4 from Warren County High School.

As of March, 4-H WAY has 1 active referral doing community service at Loaves & Fishes Ministries. He has 4 hours of student enrichment remaining and is scheduled to complete his community service this week.

4-H WAY Sentencing Circle/Teen Court has 3 active referrals. I have contacted families and met with them for intake into the program. Sentencing Circle dates have been scheduled and confirmed.

4-H iRock at Mariam Boyd started with 8 students. One has since moved away leaving 7. iRock classroom sessions consisted of 1 hour of life skills and decision making lessons. iRock students also enjoyed educational field trips, hand-on crafts and activity days. At the end of March, we concluded group classroom sessions for iRock but we still meet with each student individually on the same days: Tuesday and Thursday.

4-H ACE (Academic Community Engagement) is a free tutoring program being offered by 4-H and is supported by teen volunteers and will be held at the office. Training for volunteers begins in April.

We also have a new 4-H Coordinator! Keyanna Benjamin has started in the position part-time and will become full-time in June. I look forward to working with her. We are all grateful to have onboard.
