


**WARREN COUNTY

- Motion made by Barbara Brayboy to adopt the agenda as written; second by Dianna Talley. Motion passed.

- Motion made by Richard Booker to adopt the minutes with the added corrections; second by Barbara Brayboy. Motion passed.

Program Review

- **Boys & Girls Club/ Positive Action:** Evelyn Taylor presented program report and documentation for the month of April with a beginning count of 35 and 34 successful completions. Completed participants continue to attend program although they have completed the program requirements. Ending count is 1 and a total of 37 youth served to date. All members are continuing to participate in the B&GC programs. The behavior among members has greatly improved members are willing to help each other and Youth Development Professionals in completing tasks.
- **4-H WAY (Warren Advocating for Youth) Teen Court:** Terrell Alston presented documentation, program report for the month of April with a beginning count of 15 and 9 successful completions, 2 terminations (the first due to another charge a student is being prosecuted for and second student did not complete due to mental health issues and based on therapist recommendation and student will be seeking intense therapy and completing program with that agency) for an ending count of 4 and a year to date of 26 youth served. No current referrals for Teen Court and it has been a great first year. With great feedback from referred youth, parents, youth volunteers, school administration, and School Resource Officers. Plans are being made now to enhance the program in the future and to continue to serve the youth in Warren County. Youth volunteers and referred youth will have the opportunity to take advantage of various summer opportunities with 4-H and NC Cooperative Extension (campus, conferences, 4-H District Activity Day, etc.).
- **4-H WAY (Warren Advocating for Youth) Community Service/Restitution:** Terrell Alston presented program report and documentation for the month of April with a beginning count of 12 and 10 successful completions for an ending count of 2. Great feedback from parents and teachers. Continuing to seek opportunities for clients to serve the community and completed mandated hours.

Central Area Consultant – Eddie Crews

- For the raise the age there has been encouraging news from the House
 - Recommending \$4.4 million the first year
 - Waiting to see what the Senate does with voting and then the governor has to approve it as well
 - Monies will be allocated to JCPC's once they have been received
 - A second RFP or extend current programs are options
 - Working on County Plan with the Program Coordinator
 - Make revisions if needed for budget by the middle of June
 - Discretionary funds were approved for JCPC Admin for a laptop
 - Trauma Care Training in last two weeks of June 10am – 2pm at the Armory in Warrenton

Court Counselor – Patrick Talarizadeh

- 1 on diversion
- Trying to get one youth assistance through Cardinal Innovations
- There will be a new court counselor Paula Arthur
- Will be leaving at the end of June. Moving closer to family.

 - Evelyn Taylor – The youth completed are those who have successfully completed all program curriculum required for Positive Action and that youth. Although students have completed program they can continue as B&GC members for one year through the JCPC funding.
- Cathy Alston-Kearney – Do students qualify to return?
 - Floyd Johnson – Based on referrals and if a student is referred gain then students can return.
 - Evelyn Taylor – If it within the one-year then students can be pulled away from B&GC activities and into curriculum lessons if behaviors seem to be deteriorating.
